

# H-1B Status Check: The Comprehensive Guide to H-1B Receipt Tracking for Immigration Attorneys

## What is H-1B Visa Status?

US Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS) H-1B status is a designation that allows US employers to sponsor foreign professionals in specialty occupations. Typically, this means sought-after roles in engineering, medical, and other STEM fields. As H-1B status is employer-specific and involves complex documentation, most applicants rely on law firms for support.

This reliance on legal expertise means it is essential for law firms to stay on top of not just individual cases but also the regulatory frameworks around H-1B status.

Most recent regulatory updates have focused on streamlining the registration system. However, there have also been shifts that change how firms manage and prepare petitions, including:

- The introduction of a [fee for non-exempt H-1B petitions](#)
- A new [weighted selection process](#) (as of the 2027 season) and a unique beneficiary focus
- Changes to extension processes and owner restrictions

Keeping up with these changes raises the demand on law firms for structured processes. Not only must the changes themselves be properly tracked, but deadlines and case statuses must also be managed by efficient internal processes. This can be done by:

- Embedding key milestones into firm workflows, so your team is ready for action when rules change

## How USCIS Case Status Tracking Works

For each filed petition, USCIS assigns a 13-character receipt number. You'll find it on the Form I-797 Notice of Action, which will serve as the primary case tracker.

H-1B receipt tracking is done through the [USCIS Case Status Online portal](#), which gives high-level updates. For more comprehensive control, lawyers will often add internal tracking systems, such as:

- **Attorney account dashboards:** Linked portals to view multiple cases centrally, monitor updates, and receive notifications.
- **Internal case management software:** Systems to track deadlines and milestones, and manage document versions and task assignments. They reduce reliance on spreadsheets and ensure structured workflows.
- **Email/text notification subscriptions:** Alert automation notifies attorneys of USCIS status updates, enabling quick responses.

Managing these platforms separately can work for small caseloads. ## Creating and Using Your USCIS Immigration Attorney Account

USCIS offers attorney-specific online accounts for improved H-1B receipt tracking and oversight when working with multiple clients. You can create your representative account for electronic management and tracking of some case types by:

- Creating an online attorney account at [myaccount.uscis.gov](https://myaccount.uscis.gov)
- Verifying your credentials and identity, and establishing two-factor authentication
- Linking eligible client cases using online access codes

You will then link your client's H-1B petition by:

- Logging in to your USCIS account online
- Selecting "add a client"
- Entering their information and H-1B receipt tracking number
- Following the prompts

It's important to note that you will not be able to manage H-1B petitions fully online with just a USCIS immigration attorney account. Lawyers can, however, receive notices and upload documents there, and centralize communication with USCIS.

## How to Use the USCIS Case Status Online Tool

For a straightforward USCIS H-1B registration status check, you can also use the real-time USCIS Case Status Online tool by:

- Navigating to the [USCIS Case Status Online portal](#)
- Entering the H-1B receipt tracking number
- Submitting to see the current status or instructions

If you want automatic case updates sent directly when your client's case status changes, you can sign up for notifications in the portal.

# Understanding the Different USCIS Case Status Updates

The status updates you see let you check your client's H-1B processing status and anticipate what comes next.

Many of these updates are simple, like "Received" (the petition is being processed), "Approved" or "Denied." "Request for Evidence" indicates that additional documentation is needed, and you may see statuses like "Transferred" if the petition changes service centers.

As each status change impacts the client's case, it is important to check H-1B status regularly.

## Tips for Efficient USCIS Case Tracking

## **Frequently Asked Client Questions**

### **What does H-1B visa status mean?**

With H-1B status, foreign nationals can work in specialty occupations in the US, typically needing a tertiary education. Applicants can only work for the employer that files the approved petition with USCIS.

### **How can I extend my H-1B status beyond six years?**

H-1B status extensions are available, depending on immigration history, employment status, and timing:

- A one-year extension if a PERM labor certification or I-140 immigration petition is correctly filed at least a year before the H-1B expiration date.
- Three-year extensions if an I-140 petition has been approved, but green cards are not yet available.

These are guidelines for extending your client's H-1B status beyond six years. Review the specific legislative requirements to ensure your client qualifies for extensions.

### **How often should I check my H-1B status?**

An H-1B status check is wise:

- During USCIS filing
- Before international travel
- Before changing employers
- When approaching expiration

You can check H-1B status online with the USCIS receipt number.

### **How long does it take to get H-1B status?**

Expect six to ten months for standard H-1B processing, while premium processing takes 15 days, depending on case type and current USCIS processing times.

### **How long can someone with an H-1B stay in the US?**

USCIS H-1B status lets you stay up to six years, with time spent outside the US acting as a "pause." Extensions are possible if green card processes are underway.
